# 1.4 Currency


Currency in the United States is called "United States dollar" (USD). People have been using the USD since 6th July, 1985.

# 2 HISTORY

# 2.1 Discovery

America was discovered by Christopher Columbus in 1492 when he was searching for a western way to India but he landed in the Caribbean.

The original inhabitants of America are Indians who came from Siberia through the Bering Strait.

# 2.2 The First English Colony

Jamestown is the town where the first British colony in the United States was created in 1607 in Virginia. They grew tobacco that increased their position in the world. After some time it was a main income for their colony.

There was the first mention of independence because they had their own income.

# 2.3 The War of Independence

One of several steps that caused start of the war was a decree which limited the ability to move across the Appalachian Mountains for the 13 British colonies.

Boston Tea Party was a protest where Americans threw about 340 crates of pressed tea into the water.

When the war started the Americans had some help from France.

France contributed ammunition but also launched a naval battle against the Great Britain and helped Americans a lot in this war.

After Americans won this war they concluded peace treaty with Great Britain and became an independent state.

## 2.4 The Civil War

Union states fought against Confederation states from 1861 to 1865 in this war. This war is also known as "North against South". The goal of Confederation states was to leave the Union. The reason was to cancel slavery.

The war had million sacrifices because of the fact that there were used new machine guns. Union states were defeated and the slavery was successfully canceled.

# 3 PRESIDENTS

# 3.1 George Washington

George Washington was the first American president. He was a farmer and also a soldier.

He devoted his time growing tobacco. In the beginning he had about 400 slaves and he leased some fields. After some time he increased his area of these fields, so he lived quite a peaceful life.

#### 6.4 **Crater Lake**


The park's location is in Oregon. This lake is made of desolated volcano called Mazama. The depth of this lake is 595 meters and it is the deepest lake in the United States of America.

What are Americans like? Difficult question. If you are European you think that Americans behave like "the best ones" on the planet.


I think every person on the planet is different in temperament. There are the good and bad ones in each nationality. But we have to admit that Americans are definitely friendly and helpful to foreigners.

The survey was answered by 49 pupils from 8th and 9th classes.


Question 1: Do you know the name of newly elected President?

<u>Conclusion</u>: A lot of people are confused by the number of stars on American Flag. And my classmates as well.


Question 3: What is the capital city of the USA?

<u>Conclusion</u>: New York City can be often considered as a capital city of the U.S.A. I am happy that most of my classmates know the right answer.


Question 4: Do you know the name of the first American President?



(Keep in mind that green points represent the rough position of each park.)






